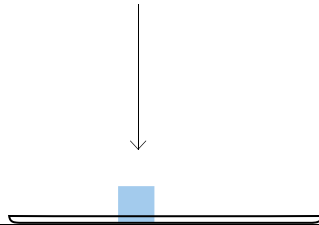


Homage to an ice cube

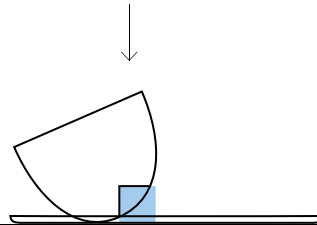
The glass duo is an eye-catcher for residential and dining interior. It can also be used in addition with flowers, or food.



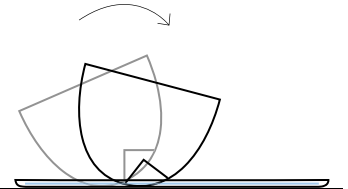
The ice cube is placed on the plate...



...the bowl on top of it.



When the ice starts to melt the bowl starts to move and glides gently into another position.



Description

An interpretation of the melting process of ice: stable and moving elements, square and round shapes, frosted and clear surfaces.

Materials

Plate and bowl: Clear glass with partially sandblasted surface, Ice cube.

Dimensions

Plate: d. 240 mm, h. 150 mm
Bowl: d. 120 mm, h. 90 mm
Ice cube: 40×40×40 mm

Description

The module functions on either side according to the food that is served. Spread out on the table: A mise en scène of a Lucullan feast for a new 'generation' of tableware.

Materials

Porcelain (compressed), 3mm

Dimensions

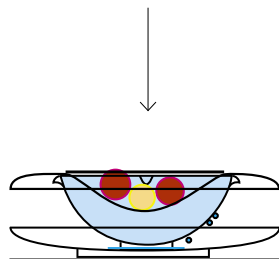
Oval shape: 220x180xh.20 mm

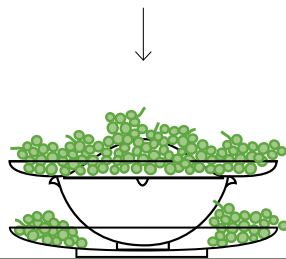
For hot seasons: the bowl is filled with crushed ice cooling the ice cream. Condensed water drops onto the bottom plate.

A festive arrangement for a lavish buffet

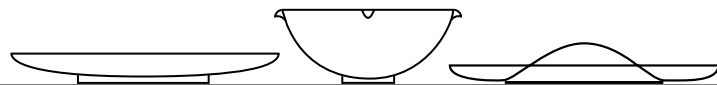


Materials

Bowl: d.180, h.90 mm,
Top: d.280, h.40 mm
