
## Homage to an ice cube

The glass duo is an eye-catcher for residential and dining interior. It can also be used in addition with flowers, or food.







The ice cube is placed on the plate...

When the ice starts to melt the bowl starts to move and glides gently into another position.



Description

An interpretation of the melting process of ice: stable and moving elements, square and round shapes, frosted and clear surfaces.

Materials

Plate and bowl: Clear glass with partially sandblasted surface, lce cube.

Dimensions

Plate: d. 240 mm, h. 150 mm Bowl: d. 120 mm, h. 90 mm Ice cube: 40×40×40 mm


